## Pastor's Message:

This morning I woke up a song in my head ... "consider the lilies they don't toil nor spin." This song is based upon Luke 12:22-34. I do not know why this song was playing in my head. Perhaps it is because of our Bible study: "How to Live Confidently in a Chaotic World." So far we have learned how to be calm and compassionate for others who do not believe what we believe.

In our current world situation, with all the talk about the worldwide economic crisis, terrorist attacks, etc., it would be easy to WORRY ourselves to a frazzle.

In Luke 12 we find the calming words of Jesus – "do not worry about your life..." 22 Then Jesus said to his disciples: "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; or about your body, what you will wear. 23 For life is more than food, and the body more than clothes. 24 Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds! 25 Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life? 26 Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest?

27 "Consider how the wild flowers grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. 28 If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today, and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, how much more will he clothe you—you of little faith! 29 And do not set your heart on what you will eat or drink; do not worry about it. 30 For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them. 31 But seek his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well. 32 "Do not be

afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. 33 Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. 34 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

So, if you find yourself worried about your circumstances or events going on around you in the world, keep this scripture marked, your Bible close by and read it in those times. Jesus will give you the peace that passes all understanding.
