### "AMEN! PRAISE THE LORD!"

#### Psalm 106:46-48 (NIV)

46 He caused all who held them captive to show them mercy.

47 Save us, Lord our God, and gather us from the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise.

48 Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting. Let all the people

say, "Amen!" Praise the Lord.

Each Sunday after the last song, we end our service with verse 48. It feels good to praise the Lord! Never be shy about praising the Lord out loud. He wants to hear our praises in all seasons of our lives – good and challenging. When was the last time you praised the Lord other than at church?

Soon we will celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday. For many it will be a time of family gathering together. There will lots of food, laughter, and football games. But for some, it will be a time of sadness as they grieve the loss of their family members,

I hear this over and over again.

I challenge you to make a list of all the things that you can praise the Lord for. During the next two months, take time to review that list as often as you can, and praise Him.

In addition, as our country draws closer to election day, please remember to pray daily for God's will to be done. Remember to pray for those who serve our country in the states and in other countries. God bless America!

And, let the people say: Amen! Praise the Lord!

Synodical Committee report: Representatives from our church attending the Fall Synodical Committee meeting held Oct 20 were Liz Ripple and Pastor Kay. Steve Davis brought the devotional and challenged the committee to make the sometimes difficult decisions that need to be made. The 65<sup>th</sup> Unity of the Brethren Convention will be held on July 18-20 at the Taylor Brethren Church. Plans will be made for all Brethren churches the opportunity to share with everyone what is happening in their church. Claren Kotrla was appointed to the Home Missions Board. A nominating committee is being formed for the 2013 Convention. It was reported that 18 ministers and their spouses attended the minister's retreat - the cost was a little over \$18,000.00 which will be paid for from the Brethren Fund. It was suggested for the ministers to try to meet every 2 years if they can to share their thoughts and seek spiritual growth. Jim Baletka was appointed to Chair the Hus School Anniversary Committee which will be celebrated in 2014. The home and foreign mission budgets were discussed at length. Budgets of \$67,000.00 for each mission outreach was approved – a total of \$134,000.00. The mission boards plan to visit Brethren churches and relay plans for raising money and share their visions. Getting a new Unity Brochure was discussed. In the Unity congregations, Rev Charles Amos and Rev Whitney Amos will be resigning from the Granger Brethren Church at the end of the year and Rev. Larry Zabcik will resign effective Nov 7 from the Temple Brethren Church. A sandwich lunch was served at noon. The meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m. A copy of the complete minutes will be available on the Unity website later this month.
