

Joint "Honor our Veterans" Worship service at Industry Brethren Church: Industry and Fayetteville Brethren Churches honored 115 veterans on Sunday, November 11, 2012 at the Industry Brethren Church 9:00 a.m. service. This was the third annual service of this kind for Industry Brethren Church and the first combined Industry/Fayetteville Brethren Church service. There were 109 veterans on the program and six guest veterans recognized. Each living veteran received a remembrance ribbon with red poppy with "thanks" on it as well as a small US flag that noted the event. The deceased veterans had representatives come forward and light a candle in their honor and receive a small flag. On hand to assist with handing out flags were 6 Cub Scouts with their Scout Leader Brett Galle helping and also 3 Girl Scouts.

The scouts also led the Pledge of Allegiance as the audience joined in. Lynn Davis sang "God Bless the USA" and "The Star Spangled Banner". The service message was delivered by Pastor Kay Polasek. Chord organ music by Liz Ripple of the Fayetteville Brethren Church and organ music by Sharon Spiess were provided for accompaniment to the singing and during the calling of the honored veteran's names. The church bell rang one time as each veteran's name was called. The church was decorated with many flags including all the flags of the different branches of the military. A large flag drape on a tripod was in the front of the church where a large flag bow held red streamer ribbons containing name labels of each

honored veteran. Liz Ripple called the names of the honored Fayetteville veterans and Martha Dove pinned on their ribbons; Liz Treybig called the names of the Industry honored veterans and Marian Branam pinned their ribbons on. Girl Scouts assisted pinning the ribbons on and Cub Scouts handed out the small flags and assisted with lighting candles. There was a wreath holding 62 red, blue and white flowers (representing the 62 deceased honored veterans) with a cross in the center, white dove below five small US flags and below the flowers the words "Thanks Vets" on a red ribbon with a white dove to each side.

Grace Holcomb of the Historical Commission of Austin County; Retta Chandler, President of the Texas Czech Heritage and Cultural Center of LaGrange; Claren Kotlra former President of the Unity of the Brethren of Austin (also a veteran); and current President of the Unity of the Brethren, James Marek were in attendance. In addition, Unity of the Brethren ministers that are veterans and were honored included Rev. Nello Strickland, Rev. Lawrence Junek, Rev. Milton Maly and Rev. Henry Beseda, Jr.

Afterward everyone went to Fellowship Hall where a delicious brunch of many different foods was served. The hall had many displays and articles of several veterans. All branches of the service were represented in this group of veterans and all times of service dating back to the Civil War and current active service. There was also a picture of one veteran from 1874 who served in the Austro-Hungarian Empire in Moravia. People enjoyed viewing all the biographies of these men and women that served our country. Ernest Platte played the accordion to entertain the group while people ate and visited.
