Commemorative tile given to our church – Jerry & Kathryn Haluska have generously donated a commemorative ceramic tile to our church which we appreciate very much. It will be displayed in the curio cabinet in the foyer. The tile commemorates the 500th anniversary of when the Unity of the Brethren (Jednota Bratrska) was established in Kunwald (in Kralovehradecky kraj), Czech Republic. It has written on it "Evangelical Unity Czech Moravian Brethren, 1457 – 1957, Kristus Zvitezil – Naslepujdle Jej". In the emblem on the tile is the Holy Bible with a chalice and a lamb carrying a flag with "Truth Shall Prevail". It is believed that several of the Czech-Moravian Brethren churches in the Unity in 1957 had various items made to commemorate this 500th anniversary. Dime Box had a plate made to observe the occasion. It is not known at this time which church had the tile made. If you know, please share what information you may have.

Care package items: Flavored instant coffee, tea bags, jerky, small bagged chips and nuts, Little Debbie snack cakes, hard candy, M&Ms ok, no chocolate that would melt, gum, oatmeal in individual packets, personal messages, hand wipes, razors, deodorant, socks, t-shirts, underwear, breath mints, lip balm, foot powder, combs, eye drops, dental floss, lotion, stamps, paper, envelopes, pens, magazines, washcloths, shampoo, cotton balls, small size fast food condiments, microwave popcorn, canned soup, granola bars, dried fruit, Kool Aid.

<u>Unity of the Brethren Mutual Aid Convention</u>: The Mutual Aid Society, a benevolent organization of the Unity of the Brethren in Texas, held its 62nd Biennial Convention on July 14, 2012 at the Dime Box Brethren Church. This year also marks the 106th anniversary of the Society. This organization, which was founded in 1905 and chartered in 1906 to help families of deceased members, continues to serve that purpose and also to assist Brethren congregations with building loans. The motto of the Society is "Bear ye one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2)

The day's activities began at 8:30 a.m. with registration. The opening worship service began at 9:00 a.m. led by Reverend Joseph Polasek, President of the administrative board and Pastor of the Snook Brethren Church. A Memorial Service remembering forty adult members of the Society who passed away since the last Convention two years ago was led by Natalie Outlaw, General Secretary. Polasek led everyone in the singing of a Czech Hymn – "Pojd' k Spasiteli" (Come to the Savior). The Scripture Lesson was from Galatians 6: 1-10. Rev Polasek encouraged us all to continue steadfastly in stewardship, fellowship and worship. Reverend Jim Heckman, pastor of Dime Box Brethren Church, assisted with communion. Alice Chlapek served as the organist.

Rev. Polasek presided over the business session. Mrs. Dorothy Hinson of the Houston Local was presented a bronze pin for 6 years of service and Guy Huffman of the Caldwell Local will be presented a silver pin for 20 years of service. It was reported that there are 846 adult members in the Society and 178 Junior members. Everyone was encouraged to go back to their churches and recruit more members to join the Society. Elected officers for 2012-2014 were Rev. Polasek, Daniel Vojtek, Natalie Outlaw, Guy E. Huffman, Sharon Hohmann and Dorothy Hinson. The next convention will be held at the Bryan College Station Brethren Church in July 2014.

A catered lunch of BBQ chicken and sausage was enjoyed along with an array of desserts. The blessing was given by Rev. Heckman. In attendance were 15 Delegates, 20 guests and 4 ministers – Rev. Polasek, Rev. Heckman, Rev. Lawrence Junek and Rev. Henry Beseda. The 15 Locals represented came from Sealy, Fayetteville, West, Dime Box, Snook, Ocker, New Tabor, Nelsonville, Granger, Taylor, Temple, Houston, Caldwell, Pasadena and Bryan-College Station. Sandra Stepan, secretary of the Fayetteville Local #5 served as Fayetteville Brethren Church's delegate and was assigned to the Budget Committee. Also attending from Fayetteville Brethren Church was Elizabeth and Joe Ripple.
