Faith Matters...

Homily by Dr. Jerry Terrill – **Psalm 147: 16-17 (NIV)**

“He spreads the snow like wool and scatters the frost like ashes.

He hurls down his hail like pebbles. Who can withstand his icy blast?

This past week is a reminder that God is in control of this world. The best efforts of mice and men, women, come to naught. I know that many of you have experienced a terrible week with no power, no heat, and no water. Several of you have experienced forty-eight to seventy-two hours without power. You truly have experienced the tempest of this cold, bitter storm.

Job 37: 9: The tempest comes out from its chamber, the cold from the driving winds

Job 37: 6: He says to the snow, ‘Fall on the earth,’ and to the rain shower, ‘Be a mighty downpour.’

This week we received the down pour from the skies filled with snow, ice, and freezing rain, reminding us that our strength and refuge come from God. The Apostle Paul writes: 27 I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked. But the book of Psalms reminds us in chapter 1: 2 – 3... (our) delight is in the law of the LORD, and who (ever) meditates on his law, day, and night. ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season.

Psalms 23: 4 – 5 Shares with us: Even though I walk through the darkest valley, you are with me...my cup overflows.

God desires for each of us to grow during the storms that life brings. John 15: 4 tells us that “we can not bear fruit unless we remain on the vine tied to the tree of life, our Lord Jesus Christ.” NKJV Isaiah 45: 3: “I will give you the treasures of darkness And hidden riches of secret places, That you may know that I, am the LORD, Who will call *you* by your name!”

Amid power outages, no electricity, no heat, no water, with broken pipes we are to call upon the name of the Lord meditating on *the treasures of darkness*. Exodus 14: 14 shares with us: “The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still.” This winter storm brought us to our knees helping us to remember the words of Hebrews 13: 5 ... “Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.”
